- To be well acquainted with the National Education Guidelines and other applicable legislation, so that they may ensure Middleton Grange School compliance.
- To always act corporately, holding each other accountable for actions regarding Board functions.
- To attend, be prepared for, and take an active role in monthly Board of Trustees meetings.
- To take special responsibilities and be involved in a minimum of one Board committee.
- To attend special meetings, when called.
- To attend special school activities – for example Easter service/Prizegiving.
